





Now the weather is changing and nesting season is over, Buxhall Parish Council would like to remind residents of their legal responsibility to maintain hedges adjacent to public roads and pavements. This way we can ensure visibility and accessibility for all road and path users. If neglected hedges become a significant hazard, we will contact the owner or refer the issue to Suffolk Highways for formal action.

There has been a report of dumped garden waste along the footpath running between Mill Road and Brettenham Road. This has been reported to MSDC as unfortunately it's blocking the ditch and parts of the path. All garden waste should be disposed of appropriately – either via your brown bin or a trip to the waste recycling centre. Even garden waste counts as fly tipping!






